

COVID-19 Health & Safety Precautions

General Guidance

For all student visit scenarios, whether inside or outside, TSCA will follow the guidance below:

- Ensure at least 6 feet separation among individual visitors not within the same household, including when entering and leaving the school facility. Entry and departure will be staggered to allow students and staff to maintain social distancing while entering and departing.
- Screen all potential students and/or parent (or legal guardian) visitors before they access a school facility for any of the following new or worsening signs or symptoms of possible COVID-19:
 - ♣ Cough
 - ♣ Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - ♣ Chills
 - ♣ Repeated shaking with chills
 - ♣ Muscle pain
 - ♣ Headache
 - ♣ Sore throat
 - ♣ Loss of taste or smell
 - ♣ Diarrhea
 - ♣ Feeling feverish or a measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit
 - ♣ Known close contact with a person who is lab confirmed to have COVID-19

PLEASE NOTE:

- TSCA cannot allow students and/or parent (or legal guardian) visitors access to the school until:
 - ♣ In the case of an individual who was diagnosed with COVID-19, the individual may visit the school when all three of the following criteria are met: at least 3 days (72 hours) have passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications); and the individual has improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath); and at least 7 days have passed since symptoms first appeared; or
 - ♣ In the case of an individual who has symptoms that could be COVID-19 and does not get evaluated by a medical professional or tested for COVID-19, the individual is assumed to have COVID-19, and the individual may not visit the school until the individual has completed the same three-step criteria listed above; or
 - ♣ If the individual has symptoms that could be COVID-19 and wants to visit the school before completing the above self-isolation period, the individual must obtain a medical professional's note clearing the individual for return based on an alternative diagnosis.
- TSCA cannot allow an individual with known close contact to a person who is lab-confirmed to have COVID-19 to visit the school until the end of the 14-day self-quarantine period from the last date of exposure.

- We will ensure that students and/or parent (or legal guardian) visitors appropriately disinfect their hands, including prior to accessing school facilities and after the use of restroom facilities. We will provide hand sanitizer at regular access points for students, parent (or legal guardian) visitors, and staff.

Guidance for Student Visits Inside School Facilities

In addition to the general guidance outlined above, the following guidance applies:

- All TSCA faculty and staff, students, or other visitors will wear face coverings (over the nose and mouth). Everyone is also encouraged to wear rubber gloves, if available.
- TSCA will convene students and school employees together in groups of no more than 5 persons at a time within a confined interior space.
 - Parents (or legal guardians) can participate in school visits if their participation is needed. In these cases, parents (or legal guardians) should follow the guidance in this document. TSCA, in partnership with our parents (or legal guardians), will consider how to minimize visitors to the school when they are not needed, to reduce the number of individual interactions during a visit.
- TSCA will consider allowing students who are high-risk because of other conditions or who live with older family members or other high-risk individuals to visit when there is a smaller concentration of individuals at the school.
- Additionally, TSCA will clean and sanitize bathrooms, doorknobs, and other commonly touched surfaces prior to and following the visit.
